PROJECT UPDATES

Based on your feedback, we have made minor modifications to the Project layout. We have moved the Project collector substation approximately 200 metres south to be located entirely on NE 13-15-21 W4M. We have made minor adjustments to the Project boundary to consider additional environmental setbacks which resulted in 5 Power Conversion Stations being moved and a very small number of panels being moved or removed. No change to the Project's electrical capacity is expected due to these modifications.

- a **Project Layout Comparison Map**, showing the proposed changes to the project infrastructure, and minor changes to the Project fence line;
- an updated **Predicted Noise Contour Map**; and
- the **Alberta Utilities Commission Brochure, Public involvement in a proposed utility development**.
